Roof -1 (Slanting Roof)

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The lexical variants presented in the note below are arranged according to their frequency of occurrence in the survey data-from most frequent to least frequent.

The following words were elicited for the concept 'slanting roof' (*utərte č*^həppər) in different dialects of Marathi: *kəul, kəulə, kəularu, kəyelu, kəwəl, kəwel, kəwela, kəwlai, koylu, kəula, kəwlər, kəular, kəwlar, kolaru, kəulacə g*^hər, č^həppər, č^həpər, č^həprə, č^həprə, č^həprə, č^həpra, čəppra, č^həpra, čəppra, č^həpri, č^həpərus, səpar, səpre, səpri, šəppər, səppri, səppre, səppər, səpər, səpra, səpra, č^hət, čət, šət, č^hetrə, sət, c^het, k^haprel, k^hapər, k^hapri, k^haprya, k^hapran, bilayət k^həprel, d^habə, d^haba, d^hawa, ad, ada, alə, ara, həd, hadya, pak ,paka, pakë, pakə, don pakki, pak^hə, pak^ha, pak^hi, pakkə, pakya, pəkk^hya, pak^hadya, pakadi, morpak, nəlya, nəliya, nəriye, tin, šed, wərən, wərni, šiwar, kot^ha, rupkam, malwəd, šawni, č^hawni, sani, pədwi, mowule, mol, səjja, təpra, təpera, saywan, saywər, pədədi, dol, d^hape, d^hapə, səlap, mawți, mawț^hi, pəlad, maṇdəṇ, kuṭaru, moge, j^hakan, tiba, pansər, m^halət, saṭa, məgri, d^hai, g^hone, wəynaţ, ura šəṭan,t^həṭṭtyar; k^hopdi, kəbelu patən, təsma, mət^han etc.

It was observed that the concept 'slanting roof' is referred to by its function and the material used to make roofs. The words $\check{c}^h \partial p \rho \partial r$ and $\check{c}^h \partial t$ were reported along with the words kaula, nalya, khaprya and their phonetic variants in regions where slanting roofs are made using material such as khaprya 'a type of clay roof tiles', kaula 'a type of clay roof tiles' or nalya 'a type of curved roof tiles'. The word koularu was observed in most of the regions in Maharashtra while the word ada was reported more frequently in Pune district; the words ad and ada were reported as its phonetic variants. The word *madyar* was observed in Sawantwadi taluka of Sindhudurg, a district adjacent to Goa. The word *nalya* and its phonetic variants were observed in Sindhudurg and Ratnagiri districts. The word khaprel and its phonetic variants were reported widely in Marathwada and Vidarbha regions. The words hara, nale, nale were reported infrequently by Marathi speakers of the Muslim communities. The word waran and its phonetic variants were noted in Bhandara and Chandrapur districts. In Aurangabad and Nashik districts, slanting roofs made using hay are referred to as $\check{c}^h \partial p \rho \partial r$ whereas slanting roofs made using clay roof tiles are referred to as koularu or č^hot. In Addition, the words bengrol, morpak, kobelu, *d^hopatge* were observed among members of the Marar, Matang, Kunbi and Gond communities respectively. The word *tin* and its phonetic variants were observed in Marathwada and Vidarbha regions.
