

## Bolt – 1 (Type of bolt or a device used to shut doors in modern houses)

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The lexical variants presented in the note below are arranged according to their frequency of occurrence in the survey data-from most frequent to least frequent.

‘Bolt’ (*kəḍi* in the standard dialect of Marathi) is a device that is used to shut the door in a modern house. For this concept, the words *kəḍi*, *kəḍikoyəṇḍa* are commonly used throughout Maharashtra. The following words were reported as its variants in various geographical locations: *kəḍi*, *koḍi*, *kəri*, *kəli*, *kərči*, *kəḍči*, *kəḍikoyəṇḍa*, *kəḍikoṇḍa*, *kəḍikoṇḍka*, *k<sup>w</sup>əyəṇḍa*, *koyəṇḍa*, *koṇḍa*, *koṇḍo*, *koṇḍe*, *koṇḍka*, *koenḍa*, *kəḍokoṇḍo*, *k<sup>h</sup>oṇḍya*, *kəwəḍ koṇḍa*, *sak<sup>h</sup>əl*, *sakəli*, *sak<sup>h</sup>(ə)li*, *səṅkəl*, *səṅkəli*, *sak<sup>h</sup>ri*, *sakri*, *sakḍi*, *sakəyi*, *saklikoṇḍa*, *sakərkoṇḍa*, *kulaba*, *kulabi*, *kulapa*, *kulap*, *koṇḍi*, *kunḍi*, *gunḍi*, *aḍna*, *aḍni*, *aḍki*, *aḍegəli*, *aḍkana*, *aḍno*, *aḍ<sup>h</sup>o*, *aḍnin*, *aḍəw*, *aḍčI*, *haṇḍrəp*, *həṇḍəl*, *iṅḍəl*, *iṅḍəl*, *həṅḍəl*, *drəp*, *dandū*, *kili*, *k<sup>h</sup>ili*, *k<sup>h</sup>iḷi*, *k<sup>h</sup>iḷ*, *k<sup>h</sup>illi*, *k<sup>h</sup>iṭi*, *kəbji*, *kəbja*, *səṭəkni*, *ṭucukni*, *ṭicukni*, *ṭicəkni*, *bijagri*, *bijagḍi*, *bijakri*, *ṭapra*, *kilip*, *səḍa*, *cawi*, *huk*, *šəṭəl*, *iṅjis*, *gujər*, *lak*, *lək*, etc.

It was also observed that the concept ‘bolt’ occasionally is referred to by the names of objects which constitute the bolt. For example, *sak<sup>h</sup>əli* ‘chain’, *k<sup>h</sup>iḷi* ‘a kind of bolt’, *huk* ‘hook’. Borrowings from English such as *lək*, *həṇḍəl*, *iṅjis* too were noted to refer to the ‘bolt used for modern type of doors.’
