

Broom-2 (Floor broom in a modern style house)

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The lexical variants presented in the note below are arranged according to their frequency of occurrence in the survey data—from most frequent to least frequent.

The following words were reported in Maharashtra to refer to the concept of a floor broom in a modern-style house: *j^haḍu*, *jaḍu*, *ḷ^haḍu*, *j^haru*, *j^haḷu*, *j^haḍi*, *j^haru*, *j^haḍwən*, *j^haḍwa*, *šindica j^haḍu*, *sindica j^haḍu* *ṣtail j^haḍu*, *p^hul^haḍu*, *saḷuj^haḍu*, *j^haḍni*, *j^haḍna*, *j^haḷni*, *ḷ^hanni*, *j^haḅno*, *k^həraṭa*, *k^haṭṭa*, *kirsuni*, *kərsuni*, *kərsuṅḍi*, *kərsuli*, *p^həḍa*, *p^həḍi*, *bahəri*, *b^hara*, *bahra*, *b^haro*, *bayri*, *baheri*, *b^haḍi*, *baḍi*, *baḍi*, *bera*, *b^hayḍi*, *boəri*, *bag bahəri*, *moḷ*, *moḷ*, *məwali*, *mowəl*, *moḷači*, *məwelu*, *širai*, *širau*, *širwa*, *širawa*, *širai*, *širaw*, *širi*, *šipri*, *kuca*, *kucca*, *kunca*, *kuccaj^haḷu*, *saḷuta*, *saḷata*, *sauta saḷati*, *saḷota*, *saḷuca*, *səlate*, *səlata*, *səraṭa*, *halto*, *butari*, *butara*, *b^hutari*, *butura*, *waḍwən*, *waḍ^hwən*, *warwən*, *g^hoḷ*, *sarən*, *san*, *məyra*, *məyer*, *məyuri*, *məyeri*, *məwera*, *moyḍa*, *kəisar*, *kesri*, *kəsur*, *kəysar*, *loṭna*, *ləkšumi*, *basor*, *basəwəro*, *bok^hri*, *junu*, *muṭ*, *piši*, *mugḍa*, *buḍuk*, *mulam* etc.

Of these, *j^haḍu* and its phonetic variants *j^haru*, *j^haḷu*, etc. were attested in all the districts of Maharashtra; while *bahəri* and its phonetic variants *bayri*, *baheri*, *baḍi*, etc. were reported in Raigad, Palghar, Dhule, Nandurbar, and Gadchiroli districts.
